



The Converse Junction has a total of 3 miles of paved trail. It was completed in 2015. The Trail actually now goes to downtown Converse. The one unusual feature is a beautiful bridge over an active railroad. The trail does some meandering off the old rail bed and you can see the beautiful farmland of the area. Once you get to Converse you will find a quaint town with shops and restaurants. Future plans are to head westward further into Miami County and eventually connect to the Nickel Plate Trail.

The Sweetser Switch had the original mile paved in 1995 and phase 2 and 3 followed. This trail now has 4 miles of trail. The last phase was completed in 2016. Along this well-groomed trail you will find 2 covered bridges, train cars, a dog park, a statue of Garfield and several shelter houses. You will also find the only modern restroom along this fine route. In Sweetser you can stop and take advantage of their nice restaurants.

The Cardinal Greenway is the longest trail in Indiana. Only the Grant County section is shown here. The entire trail is 62 miles long. It stretches from Marion to Richmond. The gap between Jonesboro and Gaston is actually 11 mapped miles of a low traffic roadway. Area planners are working to always make this trail the best.
